SPECIAL TELECONFERENCE NOTICE

Pursuant to Executive Order N-29-20:

The Brown Act, Government Code Section 54953, contains special requirements that apply when members of a legislative body participate in a public meeting by telephone. Certain of these requirements have been suspended by Paragraph 3 of Executive Order N-29-20, executed by the Governor of California on March 17, 2020, to mitigate the spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19). In particular, the Executive Order suspends that provision of the Brown Act that requires noticing, posting of agendas, and public access to each location where a member will be participating telephonically, as well as provisions that require physical presence of members of the legislative body or the public for purposes of a quorum or to hold a meeting. Executive Order N-29-20 allows an agency to conduct a teleconference meeting that provides members of the public telephonic or other electronic participation in place of making a physical location for the public to observe the meeting and provide public comment, consistent with other provisions of the Brown Act.

Summary

- FY 2019-20 Year End estimates and FY 2020-21 original budget estimates were developed in very uncertain times.
- The COVID-19 pandemic has materialized in unanticipated ways.
 - Businesses and individuals have adapted as necessary to survive and in cases thrive through the pandemic.
- The impact of CA legislation based on the Wayfair v. South Dakota court decision is larger than anticipated.
- Low original estimates for Measure L and its direct application to online retail benefit Lodi.
- Uncertainty still exists and caution should be exercised.

Uncertainty

- Will there be a second COVID-19 wave?
- How will a possible "twindemic" COVID-19impact economic activity?
- Election uncertainty.
- Will jobs and the economy recover?
- Future Government stimulus?
 - Will strong trend continue now that original COVID-19 stimulus has ended?
- Will small businesses survive and what is the revenue impact of closures?
- Business license tax, TOT and property tax projections are not revised.
- Actual 1st Quarter FY 20-21 revenue is based on CDTFA revenue summary.
 - Detail is unavailable on the exact impact of state pandemic deferral programs.
- Will eviction and foreclosure moratoriums lead to increased foreclosures and property tax declines in the future?
